WORKSHOP WEEKENDS DORIAN GRAY: CAMERA TASK

Imagine you are a photographer and you are taking photos of an object. Think about the positions a photographer gets in to, to get that perfect shot such as different levels and difficult angles.



Create a phrase of movements using the words and imagery below:

1. Focus
2. Zoom in
3. Zoom out
4. Crop
5. Frame
6. Change of angle
7. Look
8. Change of focus – covering one eye

You don't have to hold a camera. Imagine you are the camera and use your body to take the pictures.

Once you have found a movement for each word, join the movements together in any order so that you have a phrase which moves from one movement to the other.

Add the following movements, keeping in mind that you are focussing on an object.

On movement 1- add 2 walks

On movement 2- add a turn

On movement 3- go to the floor

On movement 4- add a run

On movement 5- add a small jump

On movement 6- add a long lean

On movement 7- add a turn

On movement 8- add one step



Put your phrase to this music. Skip forward to 45 seconds where the bongos kick in!
